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
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
Section 1: Population

SWIRCA & More serves a wide range of individuals across the life span. Individuals of all abilities are served through the programs offered by different departments. The geographic areas of service are the six southwestern counties of Indiana. These counties are Vanderburgh, Warrick, Perry, Spencer, Posey, and Gibson. The United States Census Bureau (2024) estimated that the total population for the six county area in 2024 was 344,343 persons. Of these persons, 50.31% identified as female, 5.46% identified as Veteran, 19.22% identified as over 65 years of age, 88.92%



identified as White, 6.51% identified as Black, .34% identified American Indian/Alaskan Native, 1.45% identified as Asian, .24% identified as Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, and 2.52% identified as two or more races. There were 3.19% that identified as Hispanic/Latino. There was 3.46% of individuals spoke a language other than English. Households with computers were up to 94.11% in the area and 88.89% of households had internet. It was found that 10.86% of individuals were under 65 and living with a disability. *Please see Appendix Table 1.2 Census Population Demographics for reference. The Kaiser Family Foundation [KFF] (2023) reports that 59.0% of residents in Indiana between the ages of 18-64 have at least 1 chronic condition and 13.9% have 3 or more chronic conditions. KFF (2024) shows that the state of Indiana has 167,797 people who have full Medicare and Medicaid. There are 70,378 who receive partial benefits (this is often people who benefit from programs like Medicare Savings Program).



The total population of a person living with a disability across all ages in the six county area is 48,297 people (Rural Institute, n.d.). Within that population, 30.44% were noted to have a hearing disability, 34.24% had a cognitive disability, 52.07% had an ambulatory disability, and 14.68% disability related to self-

care. The Rural Institute (n.d.) found that in the six county area 12.49% of the area’s veterans have a disability. 18.73% of the individuals with disabilities live in poverty. There are an estimated 3,215 people with a disability

Perry county at 40.70%. In the United States, there was a 3.60% prevalence rate for stroke. In the six county area, the prevalence was 3.57%. Gibson county had the highest prevalence at 4.10%. For adults who self-reported their health to be considered fair or poor, the United States prevalence was 17.90%, the six county area had a prevalence of 17.93%, and the highest prevalence by county was Gibson at 22.30%. In summary the CDC (2022) highlights that the top three diagnoses out of those top ten for the six county area were obesity, high cholesterol, and high blood pressure.


One other diagnosis to highlight for the area served is Dementia. SWIRCA & More serves as an advocate and champion of promoting positive and educational information on supporting a person living with Dementia. There is a dedicated staff member related to outreach and increasing knowledge about Dementia. For the counties SWIRCA & More serves, the NORC at the University of Chicago (2024) found that the prevalence of Dementia for each of our counties is as follows: Vanderburgh 7.4%, Warrick 7.2%, Gibson 6.3%, Spencer 6.1%, Perry 5.8%, and Posey 5.7%. Another significant area of focus for SWIRCA & More is supporting caregivers. The Family Care Alliance (2023) estimates that there are 790,000 informal caregivers in the state of Indiana who provide 740,000,000 hours of caregiving services. This is valued at 10.8 million dollars.

At the end of FY24, based on the June 2024 Dashboard, there were 1,848 individuals being served by SWIRCA & More’s Ongoing Care Management. Of which, 66.13% identified as female, 6.93% identified as Veteran , 95.78% spoke English as their primary language, 84.20% identified as White, 14.45% identified as Black or African American, .43% identified as American Indian, .16% identified as Chinese (Asian), and .05% identified as Native Hawaiian. Additionally, .05% identified as Guamanian, .27% identified as “other” Asian, .16% identified as “other” Pacific Islander, and .92% was unknown/missing. In addition to this, 50.54% of recipients


were living alone, .81% identified as Hispanic, and 89.99% were at or below 200% of the poverty level. See Appendix Image 1.4 June 2024 Dashboard for more information.

In June of FY2024, the average number of Activities of Daily Living [ADLs] for a funding recipient was 5, the range was 0 to 11. The majority of funding recipients (54.26%) had 3 or more ADLs that they needed support with. The average number of Instrumental Activities of Daily Living [IADLs]

for a funding recipient was 6, the range was 0 to 8. The majority of recipients, 67.73%, required assistance with 6 or more IADLs. While 87.83% of funding recipients did not have any skilled needs, there were 9.23% that had one skilled need and 1.09% that had more than three skilled needs. A report was pulled from the State approved software system to try and determine diagnoses within the population. Two main areas were focused on, how many people were documented to have a diagnosis of Dementia and how many people had at least one of the top ten diagnoses in the United States as specified by the



CDC. There were an estimated 470 individuals who had a diagnosis that would fall under the umbrella of Dementia within the served population. This would reflect 25.43% of the population served. *Please refer to the Graph on the lefthand side of the page which visually represents the population served with a Dementia diagnosis in FY24.* Looking to see how many individuals within the served population had at least one of the top ten diagnoses

in the United States, it was found that 1,787 individuals met this criterion. That is 96.7% of the served population.

The comparison between our Fiscal Year 2024 data and the United States Census Bureau (2024) data reflected that we served a 15.82% higher percentage of females and 1.47% higher percentage of Veterans in our six-county area as compared to the Census Data. We had 2.38% lower percentage of Hispanic/Latino individuals, for individuals of two or more races- no data was able to be obtained due to State approved software changes, .03% lower percentage of Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, 1.02% lower percentage of Asian individuals, .09% higher percentage of American Indian or Alaska Native, 4.72% lower percentage of white/Caucasian individuals, and a 7.94% higher percentage of Black or African American individuals. Our data is more accurate from FY24 and it was found to only have .92% missing data for race/ethnicity.

Data Collection Recommendations:

For FY2025, it would be recommended that another data audit is pursued by the end of the fiscal year. The increase in accuracy in data has been demonstrated in past fiscal years with smaller amounts of missing data. There will be a shift in data availability starting in FY2026, it is recommended that by the end of FY2025 that there is a plan or identification of what data may no longer be available be reported in a follow up to this report.


- *Data Goal: Maintain data accuracy that has been achieved through the end of FY25.*
 - *Objective 1: Complete a data audit for the funding recipient electronic records by caseload by the end of June 2025.*
 - *Objective 2: Complete a follow up report to the FY24 Annual Report regarding data availability in the next State approved software system.*
 - *Objective 3: Begin a data audit of individual records on caseloads by June 30, 2025 which would then conclude by August 31, 2024.*

Section 2 Care Management Staff Requirements:

Utilizing the methodology developed in the FY23 Annual Population Needs report an estimated pool of potentially eligible individuals within the six county area will be calculated. After estimating this, the staffing ratio with care managers will then be calculated. In the prior report, we utilized rough percentages for individuals living with disabilities based on age groups after the age of 65 and then the Census Bureau for the percentage of the population in our area living with a disability for under 65. The United States Census Bureau (2024) reflected that there were 344,343 persons living in the six county area. Of that population, 19.22% were over the age of 65 (66,182.72 persons). Last year we referred to Leppert & Schaeffer (2023) with the PEW Research Center, who estimated 24% of individuals 65 to 74 years old were living with a disability and 46% for those 75 and older. In the prior year’s report, we calculated the number based on and estimated 46% of those 65+ living with a disability. For FY2024, if we did this again, this would be an estimated 30,444.05 persons. In addition to this, the United States Census Bureau (2024) estimated that 10.86% of the population under 65 is living with a disability (37,379.71). Based on that, the potential pool across the lifespan would be an estimated 67,823.76 persons.

However, for this report, a new data tool has been found that can help with estimating the potential population. The Rural Data Institute (n.d.) estimates that SWIRCA & More’s six county area has an estimated 48,497 individuals with disabilities across all age groups. Of that population, 14.68% have a disability related to self-care and 29.83% have a disability that requires assistance with independent living. A disability in either of those areas may indicate a need for support with an ADL or IADL. Using these percentages, this would result in an estimated 21,496 people. One other area to think about is that the Rural Data Institute points out that 11.76% of this population is currently in a facility. While SWIRCA & More can help facilitate the transition from the Nursing Facility to the Community this is dependent on the person’s needs and if there were supports that would facilitate community living. For this year’s report, this population will remain within the potential pool.

Not all individuals coming to our agency are eligible for services, or are ready for services, nor is it feasible for everyone to come out of a facility back into the community. In FY24 the Aging and Disability Resource Center found that 49.14% pursued services (*See Appendix Table 2.1 ADRC Ready to Pursue Services*). Taking this number and then multiplying it by the estimated number of persons 21,496 would result in 10,563.13 persons. This is the maximum potential population that could come onto services based on available data.



The percentage served by each county is as follows, 65.48% Vanderburgh, 14.83% Warrick, 6.71% Gibson, 4.17% Perry, 3.95% Spencer, 4.11% Posey, and .76% Missing per the June 2024 Dashboard (*see Image 1.4 June 2024 Dashboard*). This would mean that Vanderburgh County would have a pool of people potentially as high as 6,916.74 persons. Warrick county would have 1,566.51 persons. Gibson would have 708.79 people. Perry


would have 440.48 people. Spencer would have 417.24 people. Posey would have 434.14 people. This would leave 80.28 people whose county was unidentified. *Please see the Graph above for a visual representation of the Population Served by County.*

Case ranges at the end of FY2024 averaged between 60 and 65 cases. The Aged and Disabled Waiver policy requires that no care manager have any more than 65 cases assigned to them. SWIRCA & More additionally has a formula based on requirements for time which places a caseload preferably between 60-65 people. To justify a 60 person case load, a time based explanation is used. A staff member’s holidays and PTO are added within a calendar, along with average times for all tasks for providing ongoing care management. This demonstrates a time based justification for why a care manager can have 60 people on a case load. SWIRCA & More fluctuates in assignments for care managers between 60-65 knowing that the state policy is 65 people at the maximum.

Using a 65-person caseload size, if all of these individuals (10,563.13) were determined to be eligible there would need to be an expansion to 162.51 care managers to offer care management services. By county, there would need to be 106.41 care managers for Vanderburgh county, 24.10 care managers for Warrick County, 10.90 care managers for Gibson county, 6.78 care managers for Perry county, 6.42 care managers for Spencer county, 6.68 care managers for Posey county, and 1.24 care managers to cover the individuals whose counties were not identified.

Next it will be reviewed what the actual population served is, how it has changed from the prior year and what the care management coverage needs are. At the end of FY24, there were 39 care managers. This would include both Resource Linkage and Social Services. Out of that 40, there were 4 Team Leaders which had half caseloads and one part time care manager (about half a case load). This would put the number to 37.5 full time care managers with a maximum potential to serve 2,437.5 people if each care manager had 65 cases. If each caseload had 60 people, this would reflect a maximum potential to serve 2,250 persons.

Looking at the population from FY23 to FY24 after accounting for new cases coming onto the program and terminations when cases leave the program, there was a decrease in the total population and total waiver population. In FY23 the population was 2,033, by the end of FY24 it was 1,848, which was a decrease of 185 people. The Waiver population decreased from 1,742 in FY23 to 1,577 in FY24 which was a decrease of 165 people. Within the same fiscal year there was an overall decrease from 2,053 persons in July 2023 to 1,848 persons in June 2024 showing a reduction of 205 cases. With an ending population of 1,848, this would reflect that 28.32 to 30.8 care managers are needed, based on the 60-65 person case load. This would reflect that based on the population, there was an overage of



staff of 6.7 to 9.18 care managers based on a 60-65 person caseload. (See Appendix Table 2.2 Local Population Growth Across 12 Months, Graph above is a visual representation of this information).

Staffing Recommendations:

At the end of Fiscal Year 2024, it was announced that due inability to contract with Managed Care entities taking on the Pathways Waiver recipients which would be the 60+ Waiver group, there would be a significant change in the population that SWIRCA & More served. As a result, it was necessary to decrease staffing levels to match population size. It is unknown what the population size was going to be with this reduction and the staffing recommendation is for the number of care managers to match the population with caseloads of 60 to 65.

Update to staffing FY2025:

Staffing has been dramatically reduced and now matches more appropriately to the current population served. The Aged and Disabled Waiver has been divided into two Waivers, the Pathways Waiver which serves 60+ and the Health and Wellness Waiver which serves 59 and below. SWIRCA & More remains a care management provider for the Health and Wellness Waiver. There are now 21 Care Managers between Resource Linkage and Social Services. With that there are two team leaders which have quarter caseloads, a part time Resource Linkage care manager, and two care managers under Social Services which have half caseloads or less due to the focus of their work. This reflects that in reality staffing is closer to 18 full time care managers.

Updated recommendations:


Based on the shift that occurred as of July 1st, current population levels, and staffing no changes to staffing is recommended at this time. The recommendation is to maintain the current level of staffing, which will accommodate changes within the population. The conclusion of FY25 may offer some insight into what typical population sizes will be. However, another impact on the population was the start of waiting list for waiver services. This ended the open continuous flow of Waiver recipients starting on care management. Without significant increases to the Non Waiver funding, there was not any significant growth on that side. All funding sources were on a waiting list at the end of FY24. The waiting list for Waiver has continued. Another external threat is the political climate where there are significant cuts or caps that could occur to Medicaid programming. This is a significant unknown which has the potential to have substantial impacts. As of right now, no changes are recommended.

Section 3 Long Term Supports and Services:

Pulling from the CaMSS system (Stated approved software system) Fiscal Year 2024 showed that 2,985 unique individuals utilized SWIRCA & More services at least once in that fiscal year. Of that population 99.06% used Care Management services. After Care Management services, the top 10 most used services were Attendant Care at 77.79%, Personal Emergency Response System at 57.39%, Home Delivered Meals at 54.30%, Structured Family Caregiving at 50.55%, Assisted Living at 46.16%, Integrated Health Care Coordination at 36.95%, Home and Community Assistance at 14.57%, Transportation Assisted at 10.25%, Pest Control at 7.07%, and Respite Nursing at 4.89%. There was one case which reflected that a service was still marked as a “placeholder” which will happen when someone may be pursuing services, but there has not been a determination of what would be received. This is rarely used and is likely a unique case (likely Medicaid

transfer penalty). Other services which were used infrequently included durable medical equipment, respite attendant care, environmental modification inspection, structured day program, and vehicle modification maintenance. For the full list of services, number of individuals and utilization percentages, please refer to *Appendix Table 3.0 Service Utilization*.

SWIRCA & More is contracted with the State of Indiana who determines eligibility for becoming a provider under the Aged and Disabled Waiver. SWIRCA & More cannot recruit or determine a provider’s eligibility, however SWIRCA & More has advocated in the past when there have been gaps in funding recipient choices of providers. During the care planning process, individuals are made aware of all the services which are available, and the State determines eligibility and approval for receipt of those services. SWIRCA & More cannot choose services for a participant, SWIRCA & More staff offer all services based on a person’s needs and then the funding recipient makes a choice on what services they feel align best with their goals, preferences and values.




This report will highlight a some of the utilization trends based on the State approved and created data system fields. These fields pulled from the State system are gender

(male, female, other), race (Black or African American, White Caucasian, Asian, Multiracial, American Indian, Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, and Unknown) poverty level (>100%, 101-200%, 201 to 300%, 301 to 400%, 401+% and missing), county (Vanderburgh, Warrick, Gibson, Perry, Posey, Spencer, and other), living arrangement (alone, with spouse, with parents, with extended family, and other), and age (above/below 60). There are also sections that look to compare service utilization with multiple characteristics.

Starting with gender, Men had higher service utilization for Adult Day Services, Durable Medical Equipment, Respite Home Health Aide, and Respite Nursing. Environmental Modification Maintenance was even between men and women. Men had the lowest service utilization for Medication Dispensers (monthly monitoring), Caregiver Counseling, and Vehicle Modification (install). Women had higher utilization for all other services. The lowest service utilizations for women amongst all services were Respite Home Health Aides and Adult Day Services. *Refer to Appendix Table 3.1 Service Utilization by Gender for the full breakdown.*


It was noted that when looking at Race/Ethnicity for the utilization of services that Caregiver Counseling, Durable Medical Equipment, Environmental Modification Maintenance, Handy Chore, Interpreter Services, and Vehicle Modification Maintenance reflected highest utilization by individuals who identified as White/Caucasian. Respite Attendant, Personal Emergency Response Button (install or one time), and Adult Day Services had the highest utilization by individuals who identified as Black or African American. Transportation, Vehicle Modification (install), and Specialized Medical Equipment were reflected to be the highest areas of service utilization for individuals who identified as American Indian. Respite Home Health Aide and Environmental Modification (install) were the highest areas of utilization for individuals who identified as Multiracial. The only service utilized by individuals who identified as Alaska Native were Home Delivered Meals (other than care management). Please refer to *Appendix Table 3.2 Service Utilization by Race/Ethnicity*. Graph below shows the utilization of the Top 10 services breakdown of Race/Ethnicity.



Moving on to looking at service utilization by poverty rates. The poverty levels were divided into 0 to 100% of the poverty level, 101- 200% of the poverty level, 201 to 300% of the poverty level, 301 to 400% of the poverty level, 401+% of the poverty table, and missing poverty level information. It was noted that the vast majority of service utilization was from individuals who make under 200% of the poverty level. This is consistent as the vast majority of funding recipients are under 200% of the poverty level. Caregiver Counseling and Respite In Home Care was used by the majority of recipients who were missing their poverty level percentage. Both of these fall under Title 3 Older American Act and an exact income is not required as there are no financial requirements. Durable Medical Equipment was only used by those who fell into the poverty level category of 201 to 300%. Adult Day Services, Case Management Services, Environmental modification (maintenance), Personal Emergency Response buttons (monthly and install/one time), Respite Home Health Aide, and Vehicle Modification (install) were the higher areas of utilization by those between 101 to 100% of the poverty level. All types of Environmental Modifications (maintenance, install, SPEC/EXAM), Handy Chore, Home and Community Assistance, Nutritional Supplements, Personal Emergency Response (install/one time), Pest Control, Respite Attendant Care, Respite Nursing, Specialized Medical Equipment, Structured Day Program,

Structure Family Caregiving, Transportation, and Vehicle Modification (maintenance) were the highest areas of service utilization for those who fell between 0 to 100% of the poverty level. Please refer to *Appendix Table 3.3 Service utilization by Poverty Level* for the full breakdown.


Looking at age, individuals were divided into two groups, above 60 or below 60. Please refer to *Appendix Table 3.4 on Service Utilization by Age* as needed. It was noted that the only services that had a higher utilization for those under 60 were Respite Home Health Aide and Respite Nursing. Otherwise, those over 60 had a higher utilization for all other services. *The graph below shows utilization for all services by age.*



Regarding utilization by county, Vanderburgh County is the largest and for the majority of services had the highest utilization. However, Warrick County had the highest utilization for Durable Medical Equipment and Nutritional Supplements. For Warrick County the third highest service that was most utilized within that county was Respite In Home Care. In Spencer County, Caregiver Counseling, Environmental Modification (installation) and Vehicle Modification (maintenance) were the most frequently used services. For Perry County, Respite Home Health Aide, Personal Emergency Response Button (monthly) were the most used services. In Posey County, Medication Dispensers (monthly), Respite In Home Care, and Vehicle Modification (install) were the most used. In Gibson County, the most used services were Personal Emergency Response Button (install/one time), Respite Nursing, and Environmental Assessor (exam) were the most frequently used services. Please refer to *Appendix Table 3.5 Service Utilization by County* as needed.

Moving onto living arrangement, the majority of funding recipients live alone either in their own home, apartment, or Waiver funding Assisted Living Apartment. Utilization trends based on living arrangements reflected that for those who live alone, Assisted Living, Handy Chore, Integrated Health Care Coordination, Structured Day Program, Transportation, and Home Delivered Meals. Those living with their spouse were more likely than those living alone to use Caregiver Counseling, Interpreter Services, Vehicle Modification (Install), Respite Attendant, and Respite In Home services. It was found that individuals living with their Parents were more likely than those living alone or with their spouse to use Respite Home Health and Respite Nursing.

Vehicle Modification maintenance and Structured Family Caregiving were used more often by those who were living with Extended Family members. Pest control was another service that was utilized slightly more by individuals living with Extended Family than living alone. Community Transition fund was utilized more by individuals whose living arrangements were classified as “other.” These are largely Money Follows the Person [MFP] recipients and misclassified Assisted Living recipients. MFP recipients are transitioning out of the Nursing Facility back to the community and the Community Transition Fund is used to facilitate this so the level of usage based on the living arrangement makes sense. Nutrition supplements reflected higher usage that was evenly split between three living arrangement categories, living with Parents, living with Extended Family, and Other. Likely the reasoning for why this utilization is higher for these groups may related to age and whether or not the person has a feeding tube. Often those individuals living with their Parents are children who have feeding tubes and therefore Waiver may help further supplement this need. For those in the Other category, this again is a population that has a majority of MFP recipients who are transitioning back to the community from facility care. The nutritional supplements may be helped with that transition to ensure the same level of support provided in the NF. *Please see Appendix Table 3.6 Service Utilization by Living Arrangement for more information. Graph below shows visually the utilization for the Top 10 Services breakdown of poverty and age.*



Age and poverty level were examined further for trends to see if either of these variables influenced how services were utilized within the population. When age and poverty were combined within the same service utilization table, an interesting trend emerged. Prior to identifying those trends, it does need to be restated again that some services have overall low utilization rates (less than 5 persons) and that the overall population services by SWIRCA & More is under 200% of the poverty level. Adult Day Services, Assisted Living, Attendant Care, Home Delivered Meals, and Integrated Health Coordination are all services most utilized by individuals over the age of 60 who are between 101 and 200% of the poverty level. Individuals who are under 60 and under 100% of the poverty level had a higher utilization for Environmental Modification

(SPECS/EXAM, Install) and Respite Nursing compared to all other groups. The highest utilization of Pest Control were for those people above 60 under 100% of the poverty level. Individuals under 60 but over 401% of the poverty level were the highest utilizers of Durable Medical Equipment, Environmental Modification Maintenance, Handy Chore, Respite Home Health, Respite In Home, Structured Day Program, Transportation, and Vehicle Modifications (install and maintenance). Individuals who are under 60 and above 401% of the poverty level are a relatively small population compared to the majority of who are served. The other notable service utilization out of this was that Caregiver Counseling had a higher utilization by individuals above 60 who are missing their poverty level. Please refer to *Appendix Table 3.7 on Service Utilization by Poverty with Below or Above 60* as needed.

The last area to look at for service utilization trends will be looking across multiple characteristics, such as living arrangement (alone, with spouse, or other), age (under 60 or above 60), poverty level (0-100%, 101-200%, 201-300%, 301+%), and gender (male, female). There were a few trends that seemed notable. With so many variables involved in the comparison there were not many categories that reflected a higher population of service utilization. Any population that had 25.00% or over of the total service utilization across all populations was considered to be significant. Women who were living alone, were over the age of 60, and were between 101 to 200% of the poverty level reflected over 25% of the usage for Assisted Living, Handy Chore, and Integrated Health Care Coordination. Men who were living alone were over the age of 60 and were between 101 to 200% of the poverty level were over 25% of the service utilization for Handy Chore. Women who were living alone, were over the age of 60 and were in the lowest category for the poverty level (0 to 100%) made up over 25% of the service utilization for Handy Chore. For Respite Nursing, the two populations that had over 25% of the service utilization were women and girls, under the age of 60, with an “other” living arrangement, and were between 0 to 100% of the poverty level. The other were men and boys, under the age of 60, with an “other” living arrangement, and were between 0 to 100% of the poverty level. Next significant areas of utilization will review services that had a specific population with over 50% of the utilization. Home Modification (maintenance) services and Nutritional Supplements reflected that women, over the age of 60, between 0 to 100% of the poverty level, and were in an “other” living arrangement had over 50% of the utilization for these services. Vehicle Modification (maintenance) showed that women, under the age of 60, between 0 to 100% of the poverty level and were in an “other” living arrangement had over 50% of the utilization for that service. Structured Day program reflected that 100% of the population that used this service were living alone, over the age of 60, were between 0 to 100% of the poverty level, and were female. *Please refer to Appendix Tables 3.8 Multi Characteristic Comparison Service Utilization (living Arrangement Alone), 3.9 Multi Characteristic Comparison Service Utilization (living with Spouse), and 3.10 Multi Characteristic Comparison Service Utilization (living Arrangement Other) for more information.*

Service Utilization Recommendations:

Share this report with leadership and staff to better understand what members of the population are utilizing what services. As mentioned previously, SWIRCA & More cannot recruit providers, however if providers who are not yet certified through the State approach SWIRCA & More to learn more about the process on becoming a provider, the provider can be directed to the State for further instruction. Additionally, SWIRCA & More can highlight to the State what areas seem to be struggling to maintain services in the home.

Image 1.1 CDC Map of SNAP benefits prevalence




Image 1.2 CDC Map of Food Insecurity prevalence




Image 1.3 CDC Map of Social Isolation Prevalence




Image 1.4 June 2024 Dashboard Careplanned demographics (page 1)
